# Language Access Signage and Technology Grant Program Project Highlights: Cycles 3 to 5

## Introduction

The Judicial Council’s Language Access Signage and Technology Grant Program provides annual funding to California trial courts to improve language access for court users who have limited English proficiency or are deaf or hard of hearing. The program distributes \$2.35 million annually to support projects that help court users understand court processes, communicate effectively, and navigate court facilities and services. Since its launch in 2019, the program has funded more than 300 projects in trial courts statewide, leveraging technology, improving courthouse navigation, and expanding interpretation and communication capabilities to promote equitable access to justice.

This report provides an overview of the program and summarizes project highlights from Cycles 3 to 5 (fiscal years (FYs) 2021–22 through 2023–24). An overview of Cycles 1 and 2 (FYs 2019–20 and 2020–21) can be found in Attachment B of the Judicial Council report for Cycle 4 awards.<sup>1</sup>

## Overview

In Cycle 3 (FY 2021–22), the Language Access Signage and Technology (S&T) Grant Program awarded funding to 22 trial courts: \$1 million for signage and \$1.35 million for technology.<sup>2</sup> In Cycle 4 (FY 2022–23), 26 trial courts were awarded S&T grant funding: \$606,865 for signage and \$1.7 million for technology.<sup>3</sup> In Cycle 5 (FY 2023–24), 17 trial courts were awarded S&T grant funding: \$423,567 for signage and \$1.9 million for technology.<sup>4</sup> For Cycles 3 to 5, the total S&T grant funding available on an annual basis of \$2.35 million was distributed to awarded courts for language access projects. ## Court Participation

For all three cycles, trial courts of all sizes applied for and received grant funding (see Table 1). For Cycles 3 to 5, the majority of trial courts (37 out of 58) have participated in the grant program, representing northern, southern, and central regions of the state. See Appendix B.

## **Milestones and Opportunities**

- In Cycle 3, the Language Access S&T Grant Program categories were updated to broaden the scope of eligible projects. Court Website Translations was added as Signage Category 2.
- Starting in Cycle 4, Judicial Council staff coordinated the review of Language Access S&T Grant Program applications with the other technology grant applications (IT Modernization Funding Program, Jury Management Systems Grant, and Model Self-Help) to ensure that no court would receive duplicate funding for the same project. When remaining S&T funding was awarded for other technology requests, staff confirmed with the courts that their projects would benefit limited-English-proficient (LEP), deaf, or hard-of-hearing court users.
- Recipient courts of the S&T grants have provided project updates during statewide court Language Access Representatives meetings. These presentations have promoted information sharing, increased awareness of the grant program, and highlighted key accomplishments and progress. These opportunities are ongoing for grant-awarded courts.
- Language Access Services Program staff developed and published on the Judicial Resources Network a comprehensive vendor and project information document for court staff to use as a resource, enabling successful projects to be replicated across courts.
- To support ongoing language access services, program staff distributed the 2025 Language Access Data Tool survey to courts in October 2025 to collect updated information. The data gathered provides an opportunity to assess language access needs and enhance support for courts in applying for the S&T grants.

## **Signage and Technology Project Highlights**

### **Signage Projects**

In all three cycles, the development of multilingual wayfinding strategies (Signage Category 3) and court website translations (Signage Category 2) were top priorities among awarded courts.

Signage grant project highlights include the following achievements:

- Signage aided in increased public awareness of the availability of interpreters, with the goal of self-identification and early notification of language needs so that interpreters can be provided in a timely manner.
- The addition of multilingual electronic and nonelectronic wayfinding signs has helped court users as they navigate the court system and identify areas of assistance provided in their language.
- Installation of electronic directory displays improves access to justice for court users. Each directory display has multilingual maps of each building, all departments, filing windows, self-help centers, and other ancillary services.

- Installation of multiple wayfinding kiosks has increased language access. The kiosks provide on-screen text in English, Spanish, Mandarin, Punjabi, and Assyrian.
- The translation of local rules and forms in several languages provided court users with the essential information that they may need to manage their cases.

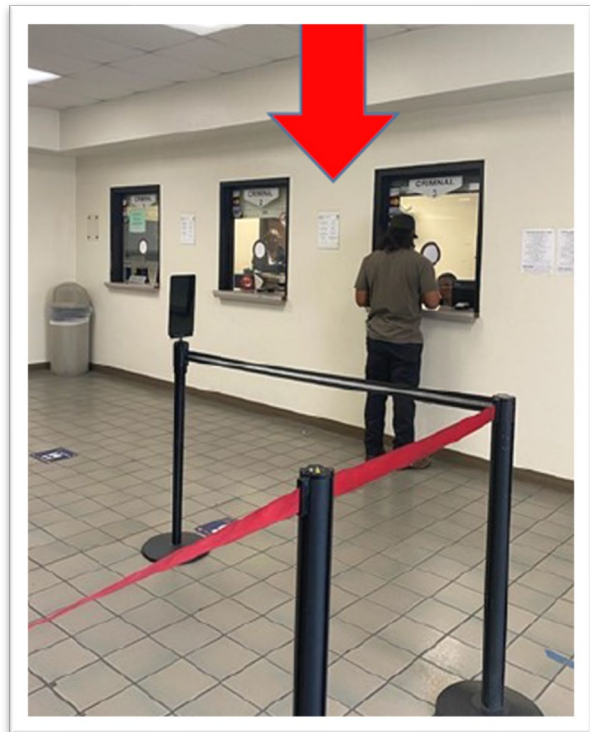
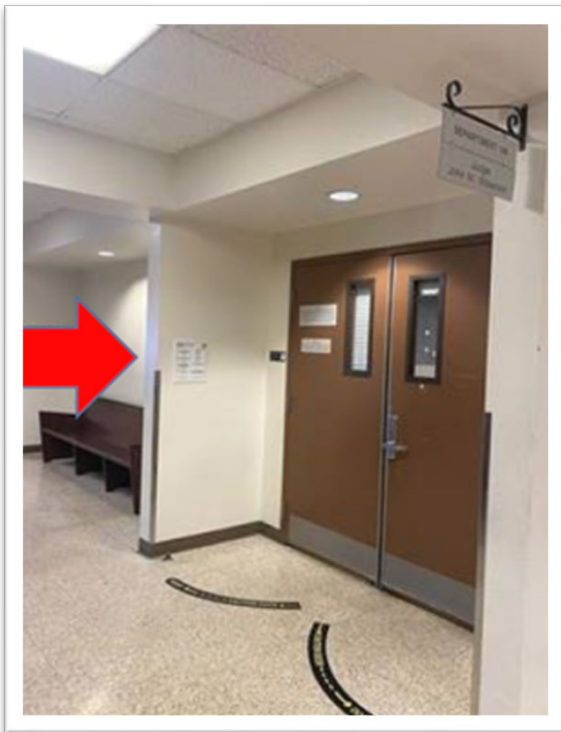

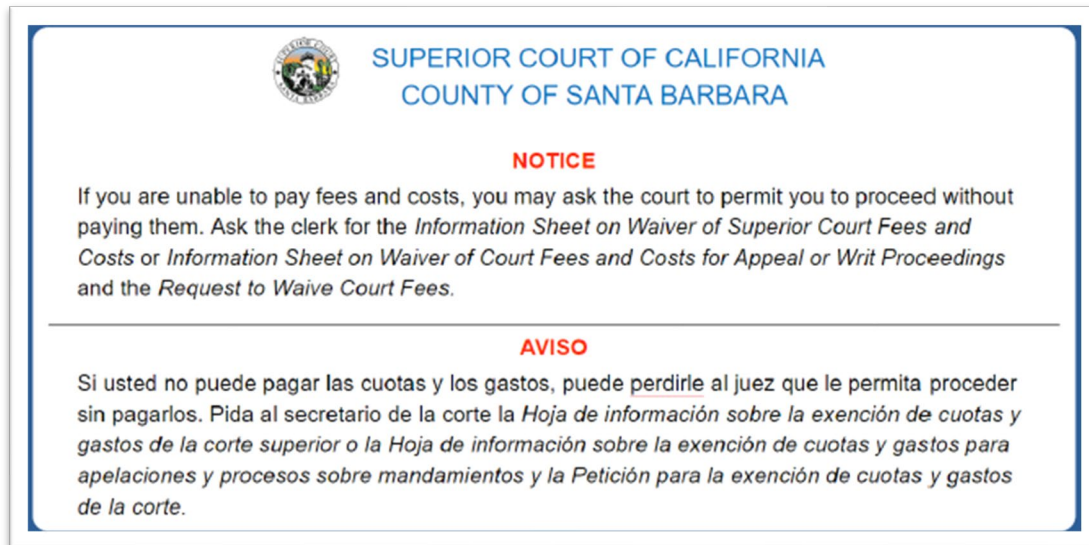
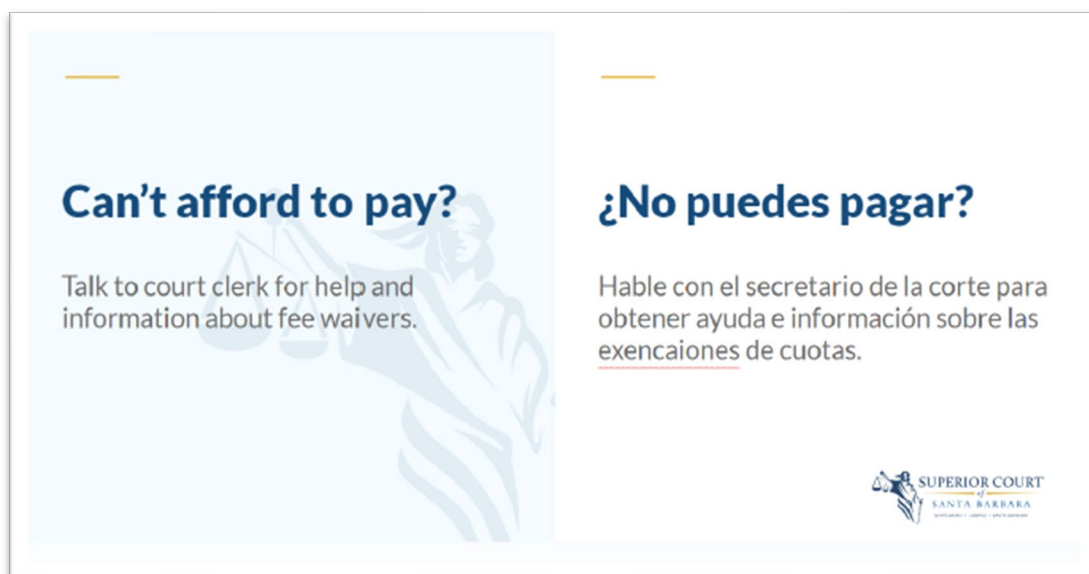


Image 5: The signage *after* the design upgrade project. The simplified design makes it easier for anyone viewing the displays to understand court offerings and procedures in both English and Spanish.

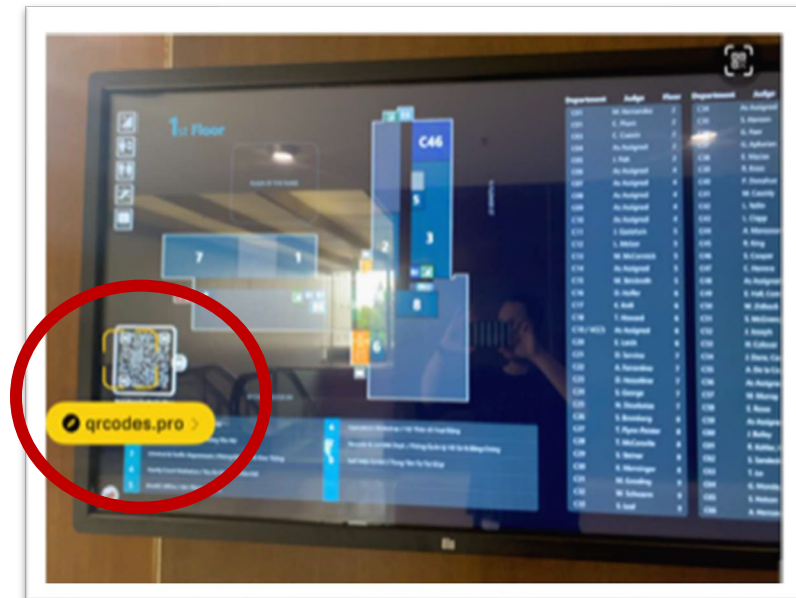
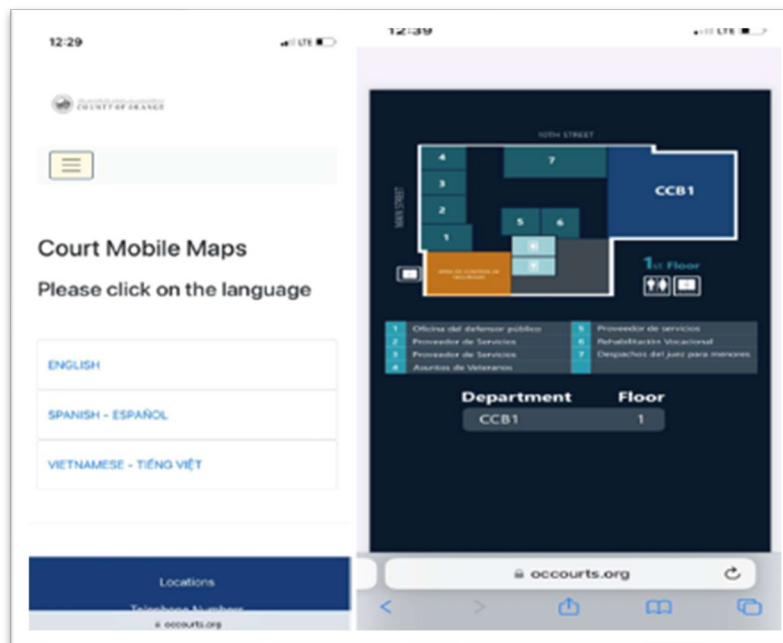


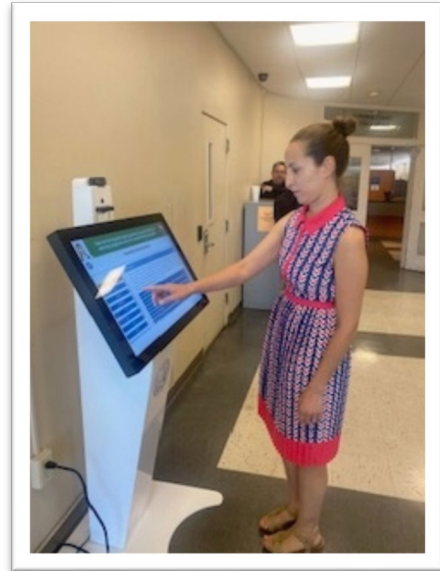
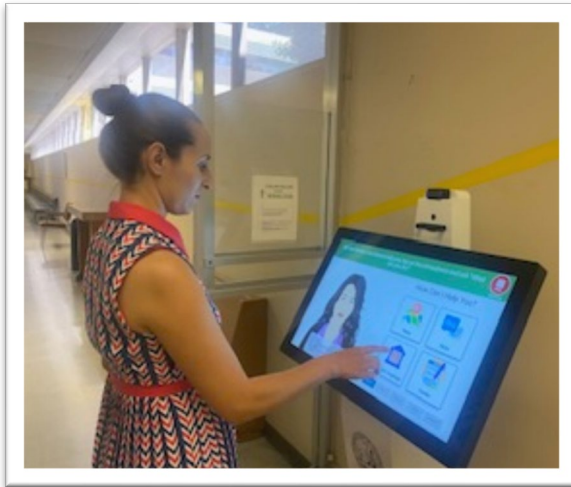
Image 7: The QR code enables court users to access multilingual maps and information pertaining to each court facility on personal devices at any time.

## Technology Projects

The highest priorities for the technology category in Cycles 3 to 5 were acquiring telephonic/video remote solutions equipment (Technology Category 1) and new interpreter equipment (Technology Category 2) to enhance court infrastructure and tools in providing language access services, including the provision of court interpreters.

Technology grant project highlights include the following achievements:

- Purchase of video remote interpreting (VRI) equipment kits (including computer equipment, monitors, headphones, and other communication devices) significantly expanded and improved language access by increasing availability of interpreters and reducing delays.
- Installation of uninterruptible power supply (UPS) systems in courtrooms ensures access to remote interpreter services in the event of a power outage.
- Development of multilingual videos in most-used languages was made available on the court's website and provided litigants with easy-to-follow instructions on various topics.
- Court users are now able to access chatbot services in other languages on court websites, including intelligent chat and live communication to facilitate access and public understanding of court processes.

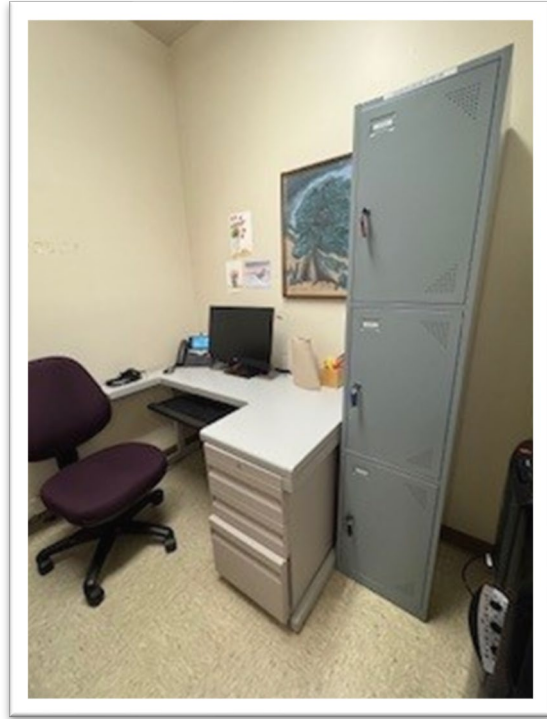
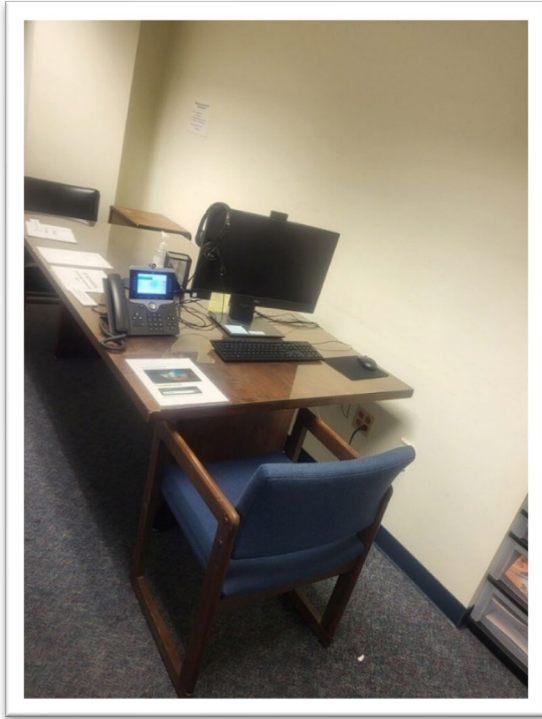

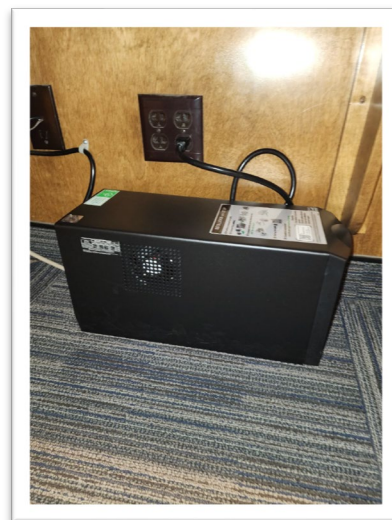

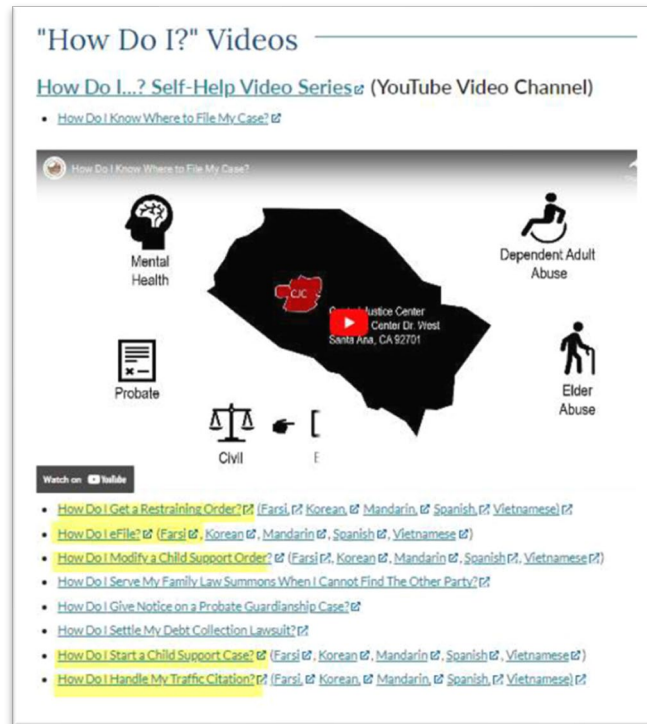

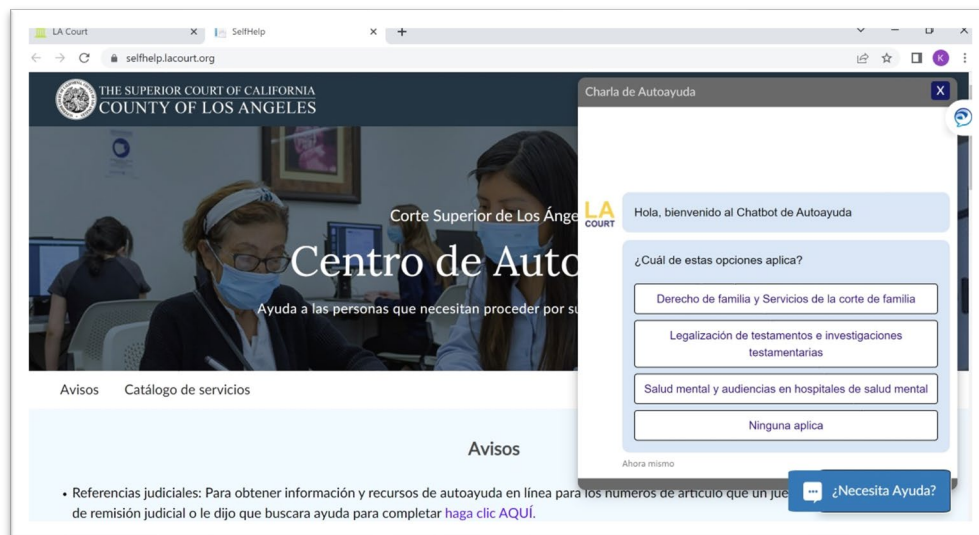
